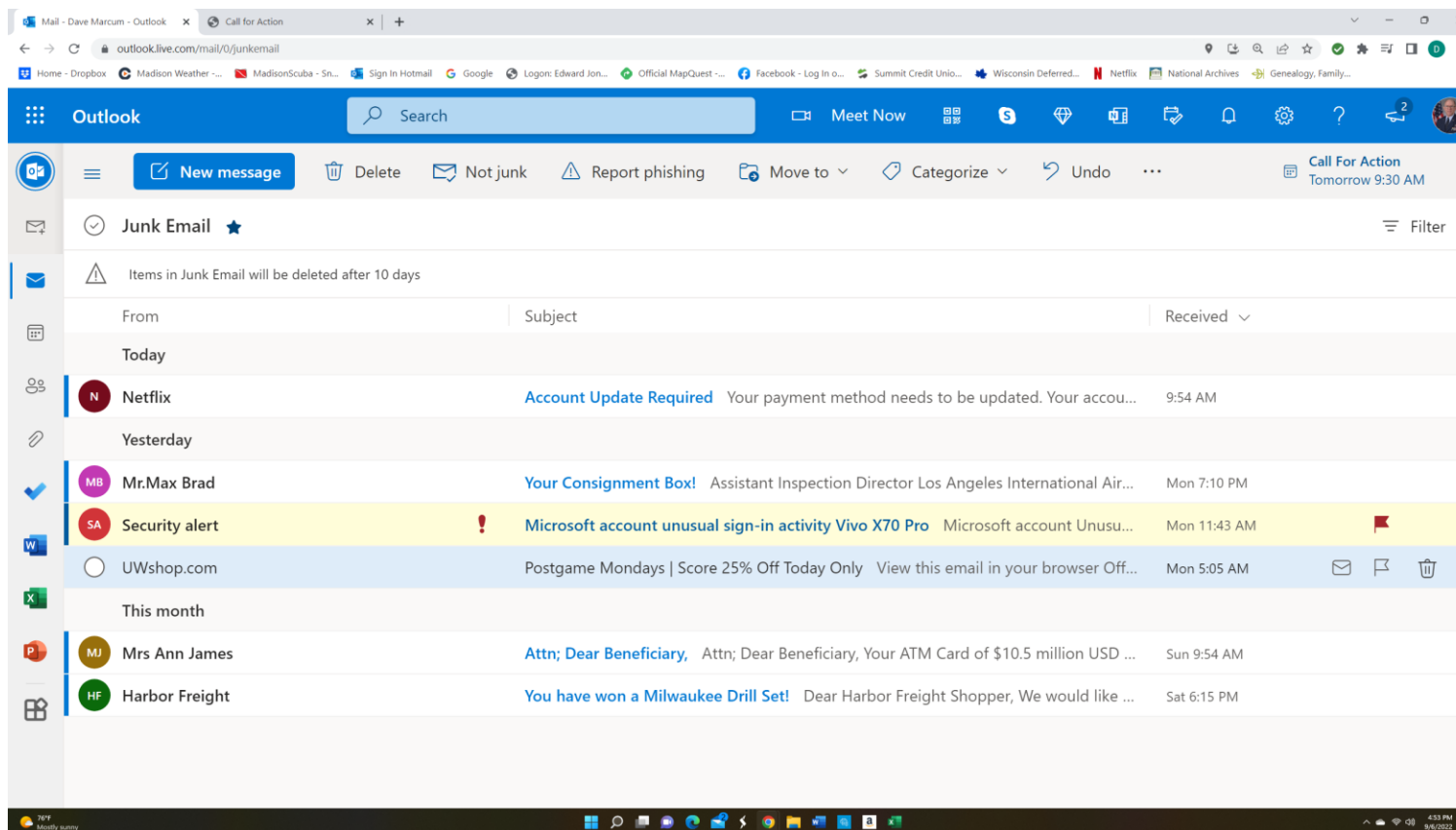

## Consumer Tips

1. **How to Identify and Avoid Package Delivery Scams.** The following link gives access to the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) <https://www.fcc.gov/how-identify-and-avoid-package-delivery-scams> website. They provide some tips and resources to hopefully help reduce/eliminate delivery scams.
2. Examples of other potential email scams are shown below.



Of the 6 emails shown above, **only** the UWshop.com email shows a valid address when the computer mouse cursor is placed on it. The other 5 emails either showed questionable addresses or no address at all. You should never open any questionable type emails. This is just a small example of what's out there. Valid emails from Netflix should show [info@mailier.netflix.com](mailto:info@mailier.netflix.com). The Netflix email above showed [info@nguyennhoc.net](mailto:info@nguyennhoc.net) which is a red flag warning. If you look closely at both emails, they start out with **info@**, but then they are completely different. The last email above says, **"You have won a Milwaukee Drill Set!"** Remember, if it sounds too good to be true, it's probably a SCAM.
